Testing FAQs

- Do I need the writing section?
 - Most likely, no, but it would not hurt to have a writing score justin case.
- Should I test prep?
 - Yes!
 - Khan Academy or ACT Academy for free, but self-directed prep
 - Revolution Prep for online, in-person prep
 - Many different options for face-to-faceprep
- Do I need Subject Tests?
 - Only if applying to super selective schools. They are becomingless and less important.

GPAs

HSP versus HOPE GPAs

HSP GPAs include all courses that students take as well as weighting for + and grades

HOPE GPAs remove all theology, art, PE, and other non-core courses and do not weight the grades

Requirements

The HOPE Scholarship (around 70% tuition scholarship) requires a 3.0 GPA

The Zell Miller Scholarship (full-tuition scholarship) requires 3.7 GPA AND 1200 SAT or 26 ACT
